Next Generation Finishing project highlights local partnerships

Over the past two years HSC has been building a new facility on our Thomas Township campus to improve the purity of the polysilicon we provide to the semiconductor industry and to increase our production capacity. We're pleased to report that construction of the Next-Generation Finishing (NGF) facility is now complete. We're especially grateful to our neighbors for their patience during the construction process.

The NGF project has already delivered significant benefits to the Great Lakes Bay Region. Our project partners included many companies based in Saginaw and Midland, including Pumford Construction, Valley Electrical Contractors, Three Rivers Corporation, Johnston Contracting, Inc., John E. Green Company, Wendling Sheet Metal, Bierlein Companies, Inc., Murray Painting, and many others. Most of the 300 construction workers on site were also from the GLBR, logging more than 550,000 work-hours.

HSC's Chairman and CEO AB Ghosh recently said he's proud of the team that made the NGF project a reality. "NGF is a testament to teamwork and masterful execution involving hundreds of incredibly talented people, from our engineers to our project managers and partners in the skilled trades, who brought the facility to life on time and on budget," Ghosh said. "Their collective efforts epitomize excellence, and I couldn't be prouder of their achievement."

Building community through HSC CARE Grants

Three times each year, HSC awards Community and Regional Empowerment (CARE) Grants to organizations making a difference in the Great Lakes Bay Region. In this year's second round, grants have been awarded to nonprofits, STEM programs, child support organizations, and more.

The FACT Community Based Care (CBC) initiative will use its HSC CARE Grant to provide resource management for families to fill in the gaps and provide support where child welfare agencies may not be able to. This initiative was initially developed to prevent potential calls to Child Protective Services and now has expanded to host caregiver dinners, which bring together families in need with the programs and groups that can support them.

Studio 23, a visual arts center in downtown Bay City, is dedicated to making the visual arts relevant and accessible to all in the region. Executive Director

Megan Koch says grant dollars will be used to upgrade an outdated and inaccessible wheelchair lift so anyone who uses it can have a sense of independence when visiting the studio.

Additionally, PRISM implemented leadership inclusivity training, which highlighted real-world scenarios and reinforced the need for understanding and acceptance within the workplace.

HSC Emergency Response Grants help train and equip first responders

Each year HSC awards grants to area first responders to support their training and equipment needs, and this year we expanded eligibility to police departments. Our partnership with local fire and police departments is just one of the ways that we make safety a top priority for our employees, visitors and neighbors.



Recently, HSC provided funding to eight area departments in Saginaw, Midland and Bay counties through the grant program. Among other grant recipients, the Richland Township Police Department will use their grant to acquire new automated external defibrillators (AED), while the Saginaw Township Fire Department will purchase a new scuba drysuit for ice and water rescues. HSC is proud to support the work of the men and women who put themselves in harm's way to keep us safe.
